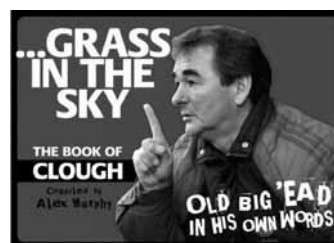
If Megson is to keep his job he surely needs to change his tactics. Please Gary, get a move on – we want you to stay, but Luton only lost six games all season when they won the league last year.
